

Dual Credit Programs



The Dual Credit Program is a collaborative program in conjunction with the Thames Valley District School Board and two local community colleges, Lambton and Fanshawe. Grade 12 students may apply for the program through the Guidance office. Students attend Lambton or Fanshawe College one day per week during an entire semester. Students have the opportunity to take two courses not offered at Glencoe District High School, try out a college environment and try several courses to see if this might help with the selection of a potential career choice. Usually students are still registered in at least three courses at Glencoe District High School during the semester. Upon successful completion of the program, students receive two college credits and two equivalent high school credits.
